OKay 2 Say

The fourth and fifth grade students will participate in a presentation on <u>OK2SAY – Michigan's</u> student safety program for students in **4-5** on 10/15. The program is designed to inform students how they can help make their school and community safer by reporting dangerous and concerning

behaviors to a trusted adult or OK2SAY. If you do NOT want your child to participate, return the bottom of the attached sheet to your student's teacher.

Students in 4th – 5th grade learn about the OK2SAY student safety program, including how the tipline works. Students are encouraged to always talk to a trusted adult when they see or hear about something that makes them feel worried or unsafe. Students also learn essential tips and strategies for being safe online and off. The presentation emphasizes the difference between "tattling" and "reporting" and helps distinguish between rude, mean, and bullying behavior. Students will learn effective responses to cyberbullying and recognize techniques used by internet predators, so they are prepared to protect themselves from online harm.

Kindergarten Dental Health Screening

The Oakland County Health Division will be visiting Hoover 10/15/24 from 12-2 to conduct newly required dental screenings for all kindergarten students. A screening consists of a quick peak in the students mouth for dental concerns. If a concern is identified, the Oakland County Health Division will reach out to you. An informational flyer was sent home last week. School Climate Survey

The School Climate Survey: Elementary is an anonymous survey used to identify school climate issues within our school. The survey for 3-5 grade elementary school students includes 11 questions and should take no more than 10–15 minutes to complete. The survey is anonymous, but parents/guardians should be given the option to opt-out if desired.

The data collected from the survey will be used to identify student perceptions of school climate issues within our school. School staff will use the results to inform our efforts at improving our school climate. Responses are housed securely in an anonymous format with the University of Oregon Technical Assistance Center projects for evaluation research purposes. All evaluation research projects are in compliance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, (343 CFR 99.31 (6)) and human subjects regulations (Protection of Human Subjects 45 CFR 46).
