



February Students of the Month



This was from last week's newsletter but we included it as reference. UPDATES ARE HIGHLIGHTED



- Metal detectors will be used daily upon entry into HPHS for school and all events.
- ALL students must enter through the <u>FRONT DOORS ONLY</u> for school. The athletic doors will still be used for most after school sporting events and activities and the metal detectors will continue to be used for most after school events.
- The front parking lot is for STAFF PARKING ONLY. Staff will have PARKING PERMITS issued and must be hung in the front rearview mirror. THIS LOT IS NOT FOR DROP OFF OR PICK UP, however, visitors are welcome to park for temporary purposes such as meetings or pick ups during the day.
- Students may no longer be dropped off by driving through the front parking lot. STUDENTS CAN BE
 DROPPED OFF ALONG HUGHES OR FELKER ON THE SCHOOL SIDE. Please note that there is NO PARKING on
 either side of Felker between Hughes and Crossley and no parking along the east side of Hughes from
 Woodward Heights to 9 mile.

- Police will issue tickets to anyone impeding traffic, therefore we strongly suggest dropping students
 off and picking them up in the BACK parking lot, dropping off by the tennis courts and having them walk
 to the front of the building. <u>They will be okay to walk this short distancel</u> Dressing appropriately for the
 weather is important. QUICK DROP OFFS ARE OKAY BUT VEHICLES WATING FOR PICK UP AT THE END OF THE DAY
 IN THE FRONT MAY BE TICKETED. We suggest all pick ups are done in the back since students can exit any
 doon.
- Parents and guardians are welcome to park temporarily in the front parking lot when picking up a student early or for a scheduled meeting with school personnel.
- For visitors that will be there for longer than 15 minutes we will issue a temporary parking pass.
- Any student on crutches or in a wheelchair requiring drop off in the parking lot must see Ms. Boboltz in the front office for a special drop off permit.
- We do not recommend dropping students off on the west side of Hughes or the south side of Felker because this requires students to cross the street which increases the likelihood of getting hit by a car. The back parking lot is the safest spot to drop off students.
- D0 NOT pull into a parking spot in the front parking lot to allow students to get out and then pull out of the parking spot to leave. As already stated above, there is NO STUDENT DROP OFF IN THE FRONT LOT.
- ALL student drivers must now park in the BACK parking lot and walk to the front. NO STUDENT PARKING IN THE FRONT LOT. Violators will be towed.
 - PM OSTC students who have purchased a parking permit for OSTC will be required to sign out in the office and exit the front doors before walking around to their vehicles. OSTC students may NOT park in the front parking lot anymore. Failure to follow this expectation will result in OSTC students being required to take the HPHS bus to OSTC.
- As a reminder, students must still show their 24/25 HPHS ID upon entering the building.
 - Anyone without ID upon entry will be charged for a new one. The cost is \$2.00 if paid within 5 school days, \$5.00 if not paid within 5 school days.
 - Students should have their school ID on them at all times and be ready to present it when asked, even after showing it upon entry.. Suggestions for where to keep the ID: in the front pocket of their HPHS issued Chromebook case, worn on a lanyard, in a wallet or purse which must be 4X6 inches or smaller, or in their phone case.
 - When a student arrives without their ID, we will print it as soon as possible. The student will be charged if they arrive without it, even if it is in their locker.
 - Students are expected to arrive each day with their charged Chromebook and ID.
- Students must remove Chromebooks and metal water bottles from backpacks before walking through the metal detectors with their backpacks, coats and all other personal belongings. We have tables in the vestibule for students to unpack their backpacks upon entry if needed before moving to the metal detectors.
- Students and staff may exit any door at the end of the day.

- Anyone caught opening any door at any time for ANYONE (student or staff) will receive disciplinary action. REMEMBER: WE HAVE CAMERAS!
- Anyone caught propping a door open for any reason will receive disciplinary action.
- The dress code will be strictly enforced. Please review the dress code outlined later in this newsletter. Metal detectors are a great additional safety measure, however, following behavior and safety expectations is necessary too.
 - NO HATS, HOODS, BLANKETS OR PUFFY/THICK COATS MAY BE WORN IN CLASS OR IN THE HALLWAYS. Jackets worn upon arrival must be put in lockers and left there during the school day.
 - PURSES, BAGS, FANNY PACKS AND/OR SLING BAGS MUST BE 4X6 INCHES OR SMALLER! NO EXCEPTIONS!

PTD (CELL PHONE) POLICY Please remember that students are **NOT** permitted to answer calls or respond to text messages during class periods. Parents and guardians may send messages or leave voicemails for their students at any time, however, students must wait until hall passing or lunch to listen to the messages and/or respond to texts. Failure to adhere to the district PTD (Personal Technology Device) policy will result in the device being confiscated. <u>Personal Technology Device (PTD) Policy</u>

Backpacks, purses, winter coats, hats and/or blankets may **NOT** be brought in classrooms. They must be placed in lockers. All students will be issued a school combination lock if they do not bring their own lock. A \$10 fine was issued but will be removed when the lock is replaced with a personal lock or at the end of the school year.

Wallets or small handbags must be no larger than 4X6 inches. **BINDERS THAT ZIP ARE NOT PERMITTED UNLESS THEY ARE INSPECTED UPON ARRIVAL EACH MORNING AND TAGGED WITH THE DATE.**



Dress code parameters:

•No obscene or vulgar words or images (this includes no drug, marijuana and/or alcohol images, advertisements or words)

- •No hats, bandanas, or head coverings (with the exception of religious items)
- •Shorts/skirts 5" from top of knee
- No bare midriffs

• Strapless, backless, spaghetti straps, tank or halter tops are not allowed unless covered by a sweater, shirt or jacket.

- •No see through, low cut or revealing clothing is allowed.
- •No bedroom slippers or pajamas
- •No Gang-related apparel

•No overly-suggestive or violent clothing or clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco and/or marijuana.

Drop off and pick up reminder:

All students arriving must enter through the FRONT doors. The police have been and will continue to issue tickets for anyone impeding traffic by stopping their vehicle in the street to drop off or pick up a student.

If you are waiting to pick up a student at the end of the day we STRONGLY recommend that all pick ups are done in the back lot where there is plenty of room. IF you are picking up from the front, you MUST PARK in a parking spot to wait.

Students who are not staying for a school sponsored event such as homework help, after school clubs or members of any athletic team MUST leave school grounds right after school. Please make arrangements for your student to be picked up in a timely manner. SCHOOL IS DISMISSED AT 2:40 P.M. and we have far too many students waiting for lengthy amounts of time to get picked up.

There was communication from the district about issues with students "loitering" at the local Taco Bell. In Michigan, **loitering** is defined as standing or waiting around without a clear purpose in a public place. It can also include remaining in one place for an extended period of time. Loitering can be a crime in Michigan and can lead to a disorderly conduct charge, which is a misdemeanor. Penalties for a misdemeanor include: Up to \$500 fine, Up to 90 days in jail, Probation, and Community service. Please speak with your student about not loitering at Taco Bell or any public place. They may purchase food, eat and then are expected to leave the premises.

NO FOOD DELIVERIES AT SCHOOL

Food delivery services such as Uber Eats, DoorDash, or GrubHub may **NOT** drop off food to the school for students. If a parent/guardian or other family member drops off food it will be kept in the front office until LUNCH. The person dropping off the food MUST show ID and match the name on PowerSchool as the parent/guardian in order for the student to pick up the food at lunch. NO food/drink will be delivered to students in classrooms as this is a disruption to the learning environment nor will students be allowed to leave class to retrieve dropped off food items.. If students are expecting food to be dropped off by a family member, it is the student's responsibility to



check the front desk on their way to lunch. We provide a FREE lunch each day and if students choose not to eat the options offered here at school, that is their choice, however, we are not going to allow disruptions to interfere with learning.

Please make sure your student has picked up his/her Chromebook and is bringing their Chromebook to school/class every day fully charged. Personal laptop devices are not permitted in school. If your student is in need of technical support, students can email <u>helpdesk@myhpsd.org</u>




Below are the CPR Instructions for students who haven't completed the online portion. CPR is a requirement for graduation.
