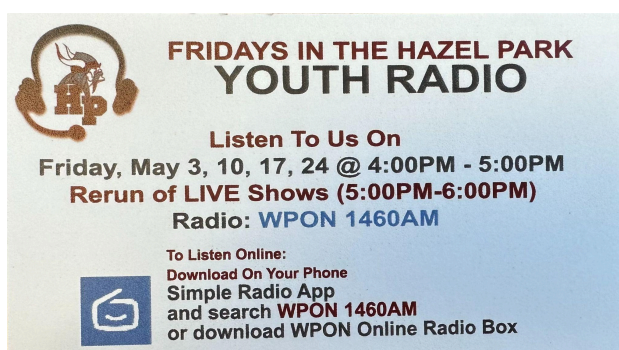

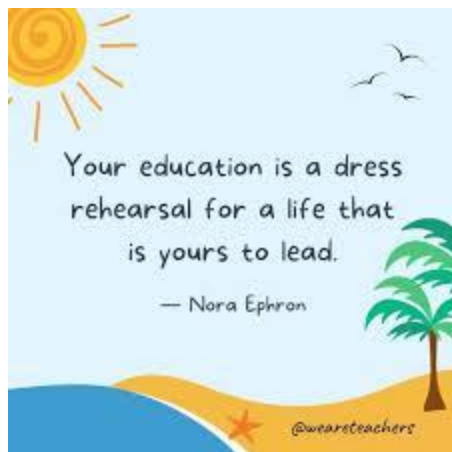

REMINDERS:

Pajama pants are not school appropriate attire and students arriving to school wearing them will be required to change. In addition, for safety reasons, we do not allow heavy or puffy winter jackets or coats to be worn in classrooms. We suggest students bring an extra sweatshirt to keep at school and wear layers as some classrooms are cooler than others. Students may NOT bring personal laptops, Chromebooks or iPads for use at school. Every student MUST have a school-issued Chromebook with them each day.

Backpacks, purses, winter coats, hats and/or blankets may **NOT** be brought in classrooms. They must be placed in lockers. All students will be issued a school combination lock if they do not bring their own lock. A \$10 fine was issued but will be removed when the lock is replaced with a personal lock or at the end of the school year.

Wallets or small handbags must be no larger than 4X6 inches. There is a basket at the front desk to check the size if needed. **BINDERS THAT ZIP ARE NOT PERMITTED UNLESS THEY ARE INSPECTED UPON ARRIVAL EACH MORNING AND TAGGED WITH THE DATE.**



Dress code parameters:

- No obscene or vulgar words or images (this includes no drug, marijuana and/or alcohol images, advertisements or words)
- No hats, bandanas, or head coverings (with the exception of religious items)
- Shorts/skirts 5" from top of knee
- No bare midriffs
- Strapless, backless, spaghetti straps, tank or halter tops are not allowed unless covered by a sweater, shirt or jacket.
- No see through, low cut or revealing clothing is allowed.
- No bedroom slippers or pajamas
- No Gang-related apparel
- No overly-suggestive or violent clothing or clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco and/or marijuana.

Drop off and pick up reminder:

We strongly recommend students not arriving until 7:30 a.m. or later be dropped off in the back lot between the athletic entrance and the tennis courts. Students arriving between 7:10 and 7:30 a.m. for breakfast must enter through the FRONT doors but students cannot be dropped off in the street. The police have been and will continue to issue tickets for anyone impeding traffic by stopping their vehicle in the street to drop off or pick up a student.

If you are waiting to pick up a student at the end of the day we **STRONGLY** recommend that all pick ups are done in the back lot where there is plenty of room. IF you are picking up from the front, you **MUST PARK** in a parking spot to wait.

Students who are not staying for a school sponsored event such as homework help, after school clubs or members of any athletic team **MUST** leave school grounds right after school. Please make arrangements for your student to be picked up in a timely manner. **SCHOOL IS DISMISSED AT 2:40 P.M.** and we have far too many students waiting for lengthy amounts of time to get picked up.

NO FOOD DELIVERIES AT SCHOOL

Food delivery services such as Uber Eats, DoorDash, or GrubHub may **NOT** drop off food to the school for students. If a parent/guardian or other family member drops off food it will be kept at the security desk until LUNCH. NO food/drink will be delivered to students in classrooms as this is a disruption to the learning environment. If students are expecting food to be dropped off by a family member, it is the student's responsibility to check the front desk on their way to lunch. We provide a FREE lunch each day and if students choose not to eat the options offered here at school, that is their choice, however, we are not going to allow disruptions to interfere with learning.

- **GRADUATION CEREMONY** 7pm on the high school football field. Graduates have unlimited seating for an outdoor ceremony. However, if there is inclement weather, the ceremony will be held inside in the auditorium and a ticket is REQUIRED. We have issued 5 tickets per graduate which were given out with the caps and gowns this week or can be picked up in the main office.

 - We highly recommend writing names in the caps and securing the tassel because it is tradition to toss the cap and the end of the ceremony.
 - Diplomas will be distributed after the ceremony by the athletic entrance labeled door #15. All fines must be paid and all items such as locks, loaned cap/gown, textbooks, computers, etc. before the diploma will be issued. If a graduate is unable to pick up their diploma after the ceremony due to fines or unreturned items they pay pay the fine or return the items to the main office anytime M-F 8 a.m.- 4 p.m until June 21st or M-Th 8 am.-4 p.m. after June 21st.
 - Tossing the cap at the end of the ceremony is tradition, therefore, we highly recommend writing first and last names in the caps and securing the tassel. Diplomas will be distributed after the ceremony by the athletic entrance (doors by the weight room labeled door #15) to those who do not owe any fines and have returned any loaned items such as locks, cap/gown, textbooks, computers, etc...

- This is a formal event, therefore appropriate dress attire is EXPECTED to be worn under the gown. Shorts, sweats, leggings, crocks and tennis shoes are NOT appropriate and are not permitted. Flat shoes or wedges are required. NO pointed heels as they will stick in the field making it difficult to walk and will cause damage to the field. Any graduate needing assistance with dress clothes should contact our main office or their counselor. Caps must be worn flat on the head. We recommend using pins to secure them during the ceremony.
- Graduates will not be allowed to have cell phones in their possession during the ceremony. Graduates are encouraged to leave them with a trusted adult in the audience, in their car or not bring them at all.
- The ceremony will be live streamed on Hazel Park Schools YouTube channel.
