When to Keep a Child with Asthma or Allergies Home from School

Keeping a child home from school can be a tough decision, especially if your child has allergies or asthma. Here are some quick tips on if it is safe to send your child to school or if the correct decision is to keep them home.



Allergy

ALL STUDENTS:

When to Go to School:

- ✓ No fever for 24 hours
- ✓ Has energy to participate in school activities
- ✓ Occasional Cough
- ✓ Feels good
- ✓ No vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours

When to Stay Home:

- ✓ Fever of 100.4° or higher
- Feels too sick to participate in school activities
- Moderate to severe cough
- Shortness of breath
- ✓ Stomach pain ✓ Sore throat
- Vomiting Diarrhea
- ✓ Neck Pain
- ✓ Rash
- ✓ Bloodshot eyes
- ✓ Feel extra tired
- ✓ Needs fever or pain medication to feel good

FOR STUDENTS WITH ASTHMA:

When to Go to School:

- ✓ Slight wheeze
- ✓ In Green Zone on Asthma Action Plan

When to Stay Home:

- ✓ Sleepless night due to asthma symptoms
- Significant wheezing, coughing, shortness of breath
- Experiencing asthma flare that is not well controlled with quick relief medication

FROM THE TRANSITION COORDINATOR

Adult Life After Jardon

I have been getting questions from parents/guardians about what his/her young adult will do after aging out of public education. While I am not an expert on this topic, I do have some information I would like to share.

As adults with disabilities receiving Social Security Income (SSI) and Medicaid, your young adult is eligible for services after public education. Since Jardon's main goal is to help students become employable, we generally initiate working with Michigan Rehabilitation Services (MRS) to help students achieve this goal. MRS helps individuals with disabilities seek competitive employment. However, MRS does not provide long-term job coaching, so sometimes, this is not the path our students can take once they leave Jardon.

Suppose a young adult leaving our program is not ready for competitive employment. In that case, he/she is often eligible for continued prevocational services and community-based instruction through agency support (Easterseals/MORC or CLS). These services vary depending on which agency you are with. As guardians, you always have the right to switch which agency you are working with.

If you are working with Easterseals/MORC and it is deemed that your young adult cannot be competitively employed, your Support Coordinator can help you begin exploring various prevocational/vocational centers or day programs focusing on skill building and supported employment. The Support Coordinator will get the authorizations necessary for your young adult to attend one of these programs.

There are many of these centers in Oakland County: JVS, New Horizons, Judson Center, Living and Learning, Dutton Farms, New Gateways, Creative Empowerment Opportunities (CEO), etc. Many of these programs have waiting lists, so my suggestion is to visit these programs within a one/two-year window prior to your young adult aging out of public education.

CLS (Community Living Services) takes a different approach to providing services. CLS assists people in developing a Person-Centered Plan and then creates an individualized plan based on the needs of the individual. They often do not send individuals to prevocational centers, but instead develop a plan with you to assist your young adult in achieving his/her dreams and goals.

Whether or not you are with Easterseals/MORC or CLS, it is important to begin the conversation with your Support Coordinator about your young adult's dreams and goals after public education. I always tell parents that age 26 comes quicker than you think. Planning early is imperative.

Dear Jardon Students and Families,

- The deadline for registration is Monday, October 28, 2024. Students will be required to have all paperwork completed and turned in on or before this day to join the team. All new athletes must have an athletic physical exam by a doctor to join the team. Returning athletes must have an athletic physical exam by a doctor to join the team every three years.
- Practice Day: On Mondays after school from 2:30-4:30 in the Webb gym.
 Athletes need to be picked up promptly at 4:30 at the Webb gym. If you're running late to pick up your athlete please notify Coach Jen at 248-843-1812 with a call or text message. Please note:
 - The first day of practice will be 11/18/24. The last day of practice will be 3/10/24.
 - There will be no practice on days that school is canceled due to inclement weather or for other reasons.
 - There will be no practice on days that the school is closed per the 2024-2025 academic calendar schedule. These days are: 12/23/24, 12/30/24, 1/20/25, 2/17/25
 - Practice day attire: comfortable work-out clothes, gym shoes with secure shoelaces, and water bottle.

Our game schedule is contingent upon the availability of other teams to play and the collaboration with their coaching staff to schedule games, therefore, our game schedule is a dynamic schedule that is subject to change with games being added throughout the season, or canceled based on inclement weather or

other factors. As soon as our coaching team has confirmed a scheduled game will let athletes and their families know as soon as possible.
