Holiday Needs

With the holidays and cold weather approaching we wanted to remind you of a couple of things. If your child(ren) is/are in need of boots or coats, please let us know in the office. We have had some donations and have some of these items on hand. Also, if you or a family you know are in need, we also have other organizations that reach out to provide holiday support. Please let us know in the office and we can nominate a family in need. We also offer Hazel Park Holiday Baskets for families in need who live in Hazel Park. Applications for this are in the office and are due back by December 2nd. We would be happy to help any of our Webb families in need throughout the holiday season.

Reasons to keep me home from school and what needs to happen before I can return

What is my symptom?	When should I stay home and when to seek medical care?	When can I return to school?
Fever	I have a fever of 100.4°F (38°C) or higher. Seek medical care if I have fever and any of the following: ear pain, sore throat, rash, stomachache, headache or tooth pain.	If I have not had a fever overnight without the use of fever-reducing medication and I am feeling better.
Vomiting and/or diarrhea	If I have vomited 2 or more times in the last 24 hours. If my stool is watery and I may not make it to the toilet in time. Seek medical care if I have stomach cramping and fever, I have bloody or black stool, or I am showing signs of dehydration (tired and sleepy, dry mouth and not urinating at least once in the last 8 hours).	If I did not vomit overnight and I am able to drink liquids without throwing up. If my diarrhea has improved.
Persistent cough or trouble breathing	Seek medical care if I have a persistent cough, difficulty breathing or trouble catching my breath or if I develop a fever with the cough. These symptoms may be signs of Covid-19 or flu and should be evaluated by a health-care provider.	Once I am feeling better and I have been cleared for return by my health-care provider. If my symptoms were due to asthma, please make sure that I have permission to use breathing medication at school.
Rash	Seek medical care if the rash has blisters, is draining, is painful, looks like bruises and/or if I develop a fever.	Rash has healed or I have been cleared for return by my health-care provider.
Eye irritation	Seek medical care if I have eye swelling, eye pain, trouble seeing or an eye injury.	Once I am feeling better.
Sore throat	Seek medical care if I have drooling, trouble swallowing or a fever and/or rash.	Once I am feeling better. If I was prescribed an antibiotic by my health-care provider, then I can return 12 hours after the first dose, if I am without fever and I am feeling better.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school or have specific concerns regarding your child's health, contact your child's health-care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse.



Bagels \$1.25

We will be selling bagels on WEDNESDAYS this year and they will now be \$1.25. Please make a note of these changes. One suggestion was to send the dollar and quarter in a plastic ziploc type bag, so your child doesn't lose any of their money. We will again offer salt, plain, cinnamon raisin & onion. Students who are late will NOT be allowed to buy a bagel unless they have a doctor's note for their tardiness. The cost of the bagel is now \$1.25.

Holiday Baskets

We will again be collecting donations for Holiday Baskets at Webb. There is a district-wide effort to collect food for those in need. At Webb we will be collecting non-perishable potatoes - mashed, scalloped, etc. All donations can be sent in with your child to school. The winning classroom will receive a pizza party so be sure your child takes the items to the classroom to be counted first. If you are or know someone in need, applications to receive a holiday basket will be available in the school office starting November 4th. At this time, holiday baskets are only given to those families that live within the school district, but out of district families can inquire about help as there are other resources in the community that we can connect you with.

Life Club

We are offering an opportunity for your student to attend Life Club, on Tuesdays right after school until 4:45, to learn about the Bible. This is an after school club and not part of the regular district curriculum. There will be three separate sessions arranged by grade level. If you would like your children to attend the same session, please note the session you would prefer, and we will do our best to include all of them. Each student will only be able to attend one session.

- Session I, Grades 4-5: Nov 12, Nov 19, Nov 26, Dec 10
- Session II, Grades 2-3: Jan 14, Jan 21, Jan 28, Feb 4
- Session III, Grades K-1: Feb 25, March 4, March 11, March 18

Although the weather has taken a warm turn, we are getting closer to winter so we want to remind you about the importance of sending your child to school with warm jackets, etc. We try to go out for recess as much as possible so the students get some fresh air and exercise. The cutoff temperature is 20 degrees with wind chill factored in. Please make sure that your child brings appropriate gear to school to keep them warm during outside recess. If there is snow on the ground the students will ONLY be allowed to play on the playground if they have winter boots on. If they don't have boots they must stay on the sidewalk area. We do have some donated winter items if your child is in need - reach out to the school office to see if we have any items that would fit

at the Library

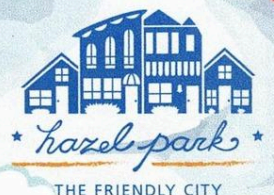
Tree Lighting begins at 6:00

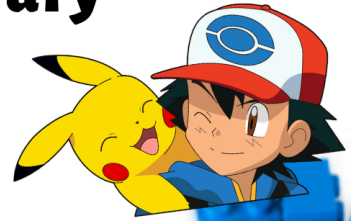
