M-STEP Reports

Parents of students in 4th and 5th grades (last years 3rd & 4th graders) will receive reports on Friday about your student's progress on the M-STEP test. Please take some time to review this with your child. This test is important as it is a measure of the child's as well as the school's progress in teaching the state standards.

Snacks/Treats Policy

Please see the district policy on snacks/treats in school. You MUST reach out to your child's teacher ahead of time to discuss any sort of snack/treat that is brought in. Each teacher will have their own policy on how they handle these donations and they will be communicating that to you if they haven't done so already. Please keep in mind that ABSOLUTELY NO HOMEMADE TREATS/SNACKS CAN BE BROUGHT IN FOR STUDENTS.

"Due to health concerns and scheduling, treats and snacks for any occasion must be arranged in advance with the classroom teacher. All treats and snacks must be store bought and prepackaged in individual servings. No homemade treats or snacks are allowed at school. Treats and snacks may not require refrigeration and must have a clearly printed list of ingredients on the packaging. We strongly encourage you to select a treat or snack with nutritional value."

Health Forms

We are using new health forms at school. Teachers/staff will send students to the office with a health form when there has been any kind of health issue. The staff in the office will complete the bottom portion with actions taken. Copies of these forms will be sent home with students at the end of the day. That way parents are aware of any health issues that may have happened during the day. Please note that we will still make phone calls to families for the same reasons as we have before.

October is Anti-Bullying Month

October is Anti-Bullying Month and we have a series of activities planned to support this initiative at Webb. We will be kicking off with our monthly Monday Morning Meeting next week. Throughout the month the morning announcements will give tips and information about bullying. The students will be doing different activities each week as they learn about what bullying is and is not and tips for stopping bullying or reporting it if they see it. We will also have special dress up days each week to show our support. Our hope is to bring awareness to our whole Webb community.
